Self assessment and computing vocabulary. 	<p>(DL) I can recognise when someone is upset, hurt or angry online.</p> <p>(DL) I can describe how to get help for someone that is being bullied online and assess when I need to do or say something or tell someone.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain how to block abusive users.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain how I would report online bullying on the apps and platforms that I use.</p> <p>(DL) I can describe the helpline services who can support me and what I would say and do if I needed their help (e.g Childline)</p>

Discuss with the children whether they believe everything they read online. 2. Discuss with the children if they know the difference between dis-information and mis- information? 3. Self assessment and computing vocabulary. 	<p>(DL) I can use different search technologies.</p> <p>(DL) I can evaluate digital content and can explain how I make choices from search results.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain key concepts including data, information, fact, opinion, belief, true, false, valid, reliable and evidence.</p> <p>(DL) I understand the difference between online mis-information and dis-information.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain what is meant by 'being sceptical'. I can give examples of when and why it is important to be sceptical.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain what is meant by a 'hoax'. I can explain why I need to think carefully before I forward anything online.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain why some information I find online may not be honest, accurate or legal.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain why information that is on a large number of sites may still be inaccurate or untrue. I can assess how this might happen (e.g. the sharing of misinformation either by accident or on purpose).</p>

7	How secure are you with your online information and accounts?	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Complete challenge 16. 2. Discuss with the children what 'freemium' and free apps are. 3. Children present their work to the class. Discuss their answers. 4. Self assessment and computing vocabulary. 	<p>(DL) I can create and use strong and secure passwords.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain how free apps or services may read and share my information (e.g. friends, contacts, likes, images, videos, voice, messages, geolocation) with others.</p> <p>(DL) I can explain how some apps may request or take payment for additional content (e.g. in-app purchases and explain why I should seek permission from a trusted adult before purchasing.</p>
8	Can you copy anything you find on the internet?	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Watch the Copyright and Fair Use video and discuss 2. Ask the children to find some copyright free image sites. 3. Children present their work to the class. Discuss their answers. 4. Self assessment and computing vocabulary. 	<p>(DL) I can assess and justify when it is acceptable to use the work of others.</p> <p>(DL) I can give examples of content that is permitted to be reused.</p>
